1. Food security and agriculture

Few examples of contributions

- Beyond integrated agriculture, conservation and cooperatives increasingly contributed on food security and nutrition discourse with a particular focus on food rights/entitlements.
- Sustainable agriculture as an alternative to agro chemical based agriculture.
- Pioneers on credit and saving led to scaled up microfinance in the country
- Significant contributions in emergency response saving lives and livelihood in all regions in the country.
- The nexus between response, recovery and long term development.
